

A MESSAGE FROM JON:

You know when something really needs sorting out the advice might be "you should write to your MP about that." I must admit my default response was a rather lame "well what good will that do?"

But I hadn't accounted for Jack Rankin, MP for Windsor, elected last time around.

I wrote to him about a Government decision to keep the Listed Places of Worship Grant Relief Scheme but with a cap on claims of £25,000. This will increase the cost of our building project by around £250,000. Ouch.

Not only did I get a reply, but Jack came to worship with us one Sunday morning and I chatted through with him the impact the reduction in the VAT reclaim will have. He said he would do what he could...and he delivered.

He's written to the Minister; he's asked a question in the House naming Holy Trinity Sunningdale and the Vicar. As someone pointed out afterwards, your name will now be forever recorded in Hansard. Which is kind of cool – but I would trade that for a re-think and the restoration of the grant scheme in full. Jack got a promise to have a discussion with the Department to examine this issue further.

I have no idea what political views you have, who you vote for and what you think of the current Governments plans, but I haven't yet met anyone who thinks raising tax on the work done to repair and refurbish listed churches is a good idea.

So we pray that Jack's intervention will yield a result for churches across the country looking to repair and remodel. If he's successful you will hear the yell of approval from my house to yours however far away you live.

And if something's bothering you and someone says "Write to your MP" in our case I can tell you it was an email very well worth sending!

Transforming Trinity

One way or another and as far as anyone can possibly see into the future, this is the year we shall do as much as we can of our Transforming Trinity project.

We cannot know what tomorrow will bring and so making plans is all very well; one must always sit lightly with them, things can change.

In the last magazine the third paragraph mentioned the solar panels, a new door in the west end and the sliding doors on the south porch to assist with heat retention. As the tortuous process of getting permission has gone on, two of the three have had to be set aside for now.

The Diocese wanted a

complete report from the Solar Panel contractors that will re-assure them of everything possible so that they can happily agree to that aspect of the plan, however we won't be appointing the sub-contractor to undertake that work until we have secured our main contractor. Impasse. They

wouldn't give


conditional approval either. The solution is to remove that aspect for now until a later stage and apply again as a single faculty request. Two steps forward, one step back.

We have applied to the Borough for planning permission for the external elements of the build and Historic England have objected to a new west end door. The Diocese advised dropping that part of the plan for now to make


progress. However, because the plan has changed, the Borough need to consult on planning all over again. Another 28 day period. Two steps forward and two steps back.

Then the Government announced that the Listed Places of Worship Grant Relief Scheme would be capped at £25,000 from 31st March 2025 which I've referred to in my opening column. Two steps forward and three back.

And while all that has gone along the full set of drawings, plans for the structures, plans for heating, plans for wiring, plans for lighting, plans for the finishes, plans for the servery, plans for everything conceivable have been with the Diocese and we have waited for the 'Advisors' to ask their questions.



One waits. And waits. And waits. And waits. And waits. And finally, questions are asked, answers are given, minor amendments are made and one reaches the next stage...which is to ask the amenity societies for their opinion all over again. We are currently in the 42 day period where Historic England, the Victorian Society and the Church Building Council can make further comments and interventions.



Meanwhile, neighbours to the church have had a planning application approved and work has started on their house, and I look at it every time I walk to church and think the same thing. 'That was fast!' I don't suppose it felt fast to them.

It's not all been completely uphill. Our desire to re-imagine the church building and create a community hub with facilities and access for all has been heard and supported by a number of grant makers and I'm happy to thank them publicly.

Converting a Victorian church into a place the whole community can access and use is not unique, but it's been heartening to be supported by the Garfield Weston Foundation, the Beatrice Laing Family Trust, the Benefact Trust, the Sabina Sutherland Charitable Trust, the Englefield Charitable Trust, the Prince Philip Trust, and the Antonio Carluccio Foundation.

The process goes on. Slowly. But, while we wait for all the procedures to complete, the work goes on to plan and prepare for closing the church during May so that the serious business can begin in June. In all we expect the church building to be closed for up to nine months, opening again ready for Easter 2026.

The building will be closed but the church will still be open. We shall relocate our worship

services to Holy Trinity Primary School using the school hall for worship just as the children do. I won't be expecting the church members to sit cross legged on the floor though!


Our weekly café will relocate across the road to the Hope Centre on High Street, and we are deeply grateful that they will accommodate us during our exile from our church building.

In one sense the process is so very slow with all the twists and turns, some of which I mentioned above. In other ways this year seems to be rushing forward, the time drawing ever closer and that

leads to thinking about afterwards, when work is done, and changes have been made and new opportunities are created.

I'm going to write elsewhere about history and heritage and ecology, but what will be exciting is to share the re-configured building with the community in a new way...not just the usual things like the Remembrance Day service, the Christingle on Christmas Eve and Easter celebrations, but sharing the space in whatever way the community needs. One hundred and eighty six years after the first church was built and pews fastened to the floor, we shall have the church as they were originally intended; an

open space for the whole community.




Historian in Residence

One of the new things we intend to develop at Holy Trinity is a volunteer Historian in Residence; an individual who will take a lead on developing the heritage and historical appreciation of the church.

We have fascinating historical connections: Sir Stafford Raffles, the founder of Singapore: Prince Victor of Hohenlohe, Queen Victoria's favourite nephew: and Ferdinand West VC, the first member of the newly formed RAF to be given a VC.

The history of the people of Sunningdale is found around the church with inscriptions and memorials: Sir Hugo, Baronet of Sunningdale and his wife Lady Helen; Sir Joseph Bart a former churchwarden and Lord Mayor of London: and the Hon Charley Rowley Hay Drummond of Harewood Lodge.



The church building has a unique history and the fabric of the building tells the story of its development. The strange marks on the wall in the choir, the partly bricked

up windows, the odd balance to the building and the incredible wooden spire.

The heritage and history of Sunningdale is found in the church and churchyard and we hope to appoint someone with a passion for discovering the past and presenting the stories uncovered to a new generation of residents.

We anticipate history tours and self-guided tours so that anyone coming to church can take time to walk the building and grounds and appreciate the rich history right here on our doorstep.

We hope to accumulate a photographic display, not just of the church and the people connected to it but of Sunningdale of the past, a place that reached 600 people and decided it needed its own Anglican church.

A Church Ecologist and an Eco-warrior!

Ecology

As part of our growth and development we wish to appoint a volunteer Ecologist to lead on the development and enjoyment of the church grounds, our flora and fauna.

We wish to increase and appreciate our biodiversity and put into action plans to create garden areas in the churchyard for all to enjoy and go further with the work volunteers can do to support the Parish Council who maintain the grounds.



We have had extensive research done on our roof level lodgers and our intention is to share our research by developing bat walks – we have Brown Long-Eared, Common Pipistrelle and Serotine all happily at home (and not one of them paying rent!).

Eco-Warriors for an Eco-church

I recently attended an assembly at the Primary school and was impressed to learn of all that the school eco-warriors were doing to influence their fellow pupils.

Churches are not energy efficient and can have a blind-spot towards the need to adopt sustainability.

Our plans to modernise the heating and use air source heat pumps and our desire for solar energy and battery storage are taking us in the right direction of reducing carbon emissions and reducing energy use. There's much more to be aware of.

A Rocha UK have an award programme (bronze, silver, gold) that assist churches in developing a healthy approach to caring for God's creation. We will look to appoint a volunteer to lead on this aspect of church life.


May your holiday time, be it staycation or vacation, be blessed with or without an unexpected £5 being received!

FRIENDSHIP GROUP

The Friendship Group concept is a plan to connect everyone in a road and in an area to enable people to have help and give help.

It will operate initially in Sunningdale (road by road) and eventually interconnect everyone.



A booklet will be produced for each road so should the need arise you can find someone to contact for help or they can contact you for help. The booklet will have categories so those giving help can be contacted directly and events in a given area will be easily to locate.

Help comes in all forms and is not finite.

Occasionally we would like to go somewhere and have no one to go with. It would be nice if someone is happy to take or accompany you from within your road or neighbourhood. Or if for a short time you are unable to drive, someone in your road is on the list to call.

Once established all the roads will be connected and if no one can help in your road a network coordinator from another road will be contacted for help.

Additional to giving and receiving help, I plan to organise training sessions for those interested in learning how to maximise the use of their phones, and in time there will be a Medical Hub with a health assessment machine and other desks from organisations offering to help.

Holy Trinity Coft Primary School The Role of Spiritual Leaders

Hello, we are the Spiritual Leaders at Holy Trinity Primary, Sunningdale. The role of the Spiritual Leader is one of the responsibilities of Year 6. We had to apply and write why we would like this position and how we wanted to make a difference to our school and our community.



Collective worship is a very important part of our job. We lead the liturgy during each worship by saying, 'God is love', response 'All the Time',

'All the Time', response 'God is love'.

We then help children light the 3 wick candle which represents the Holy Trinity. We have a prayer tree where we invite children to write their own special prayer. We choose a prayer to share at each worship. We also invite everyone if they would like to say our school prayer (see below).

To end our liturgy we say, 'Go in the peace of Christ' response 'Thanks be to God'.

Our favourite part of the job is the Celebration Assembly on Fridays where we are keen to celebrate achievements of pupils in our whole school. We find making others happy – makes us happy too. We take it in turns to hand out Star of the week cards and a special Holy Trinity pencil.

We lead services at church for whole school events – Harvest, Christmas, Carol Service and Easter where we write a prayer and greet the parents. We have led local fundraising initiatives for Holy Trinity Foodbank and a Children's hospice charity Alexander Devine in Maidenhead for the Big Knit Chick. We have been amazed at the response our appeal has had and this has made us very happy that we are living our vision.
